Larry E. Johnson has a diverse background in community and regional planning, residential and commercial architectural design, historic preservation, and project management. Mr. Johnson established The Johnson Partnership in 1980 to provide complete architectural and planning services. He presently serves as principal in charge of the firm's architectural and historic preservation services, and provides support for the firm's planning projects.

Mr. Johnson has fostered a continuing interest in state and regional history, focusing on architectural and maritime heritage. He has consulted on historic evaluation and preservation projects ranging from local to national significance. He has practical experience both recommending and implementing the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Historic Preservation. Larry exceeds the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards for both Historic Architecture and Architectural History. He holds a master's degree in Architecture from the University of Washington with an emphasis on architectural history and historic preservation. He holds a state license to practice architecture and has spent more than thirty years in the field of preservation. He has presented more than fifty landmark nomination reports to the City of Seattle Landmarks Preservation Board, and continues to give lectures on researching and writing landmark nomination reports.

Projects include historic research and report preparation for National Historic Register and local heritage register nominations, federal NHPA Section 106 and F-4 compliance, historic structures reports, historic documentation, and assistance with federal historic tax credits. Mr. Johnson combines his knowledge of historic architecture and preservation standards with modern architectural practice to make recommendations for best practices for preservation, rehabilitation, and renovation projects. He has consulted on best practices for upgrading historic buildings for both energy efficiency and seismic structural improvements.

Former and current clients include the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), the City of Seattle, the Port of Seattle, the Port of Everett, the Port of Anacortes, the University of Washington, Seattle University, Seattle Pacific University, the Queen Anne Historical Society, Historic Seattle Preservation and Development Authority, the Center for Wooden Boats, the Urban League, and numerous private developers.

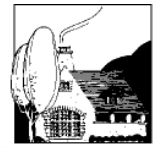
